5th May 2024 - Year B - 6th Sunday of Easter

As the Father has Loved Me, so I have Loved You

In its nature, this Sunday's gospel is warm, thoughtful and sincere. It follows the Gospel in which Jesus taught His disciples that He was the vine and they were the branches. From that, we learn that our union with Jesus will lead to fruitful service. Today's reading expounds on this teaching, describing *service* as something that we are called upon to offer to others. Jesus spoke with great affection, inviting the disciples into the ceaseless flow of love that He and the Father exchange. To dwell in this love is to be richly blessed with joy, friendship and fruitfulness.

Today's gospel reading describes "loving" service. Laying down one's life for a friend is one part of the definition of love in the Bible. Jesus says: "As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love." We are able to love because we have been loved. The second reading says: "In this is love: not that we have loved God, but that God loved us and sent His Son to die for our sins." We each have love to give because we have been loved first. Happiness is from giving what we have received as a gift, and that is love.

The second reading extends the definition of love: "...everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God. Whoever is without love does not know God, because God is love." To know God, we need to encounter God, because to know God, we must exist in God's world and be with God. Consequently, this is what occurs when we love God and love other people. We can read a great deal of books and listen to a wide range of speakers about God, but still we can remain ignorant of Him. When we lay down our life in some way for someone, we experience moving into God's realm and we get a taste, at least a little, of what it is to be truly with God, that is, to be in His presence. It is like what happens when you willingly give up a vacation to take care of children, or stay at work. We learn that Godliness is filled with love. The essence of John's teaching is clear. God is love and He loved us first. That has been revealed to the world in God's Son. The Son's saving death has freed us from sin. Therefore, we must love one another.

In John's Gospel, we hear Jesus affirm that He is known by the Father and that His disciples will know the Father by knowing Jesus. In this passage, Jesus reminds His disciples that this knowledge is to be expressed in love. Those who know Jesus well—like His disciples—will love one another. Knowledge leads to love, which then leads to action. John reminds His community that Jesus taught us that love is the sign of true discipleship, a true Christian. Moreso, a true disciple shows a particular kind of love – sacrificial love.

Two Sundays ago, we heard the good Shepherd speak repeatedly of laying down his life for his sheep. He prompted that the disciples are His "Friends" – not servants. Jesus called Himself their Master when He washed their feet, but in the process turned the relationship upside down. Now He fulfils what John declared so beautifully: "No-one has ever seen God; it is only the Son, who is nearest the Father's heart, who has made Him known." Jesus transforms the terms of His relationship with His disciples and redefines their relationship with God. Jesus teaches that His relationship to His disciples is based on friendship, not servitude.

John reminds his community that Jesus also taught that a disciple is chosen—by Jesus. To be chosen by Jesus is not to be special, but to be sent to serve the world as Jesus did. Jesus chose His disciples and sent them out to bear fruit by serving others with love.

This reading, like last week's, is part of Jesus' Last Supper discourse. We know that Jesus gave the greatest example of love and service. He laid down His life for His friends, His disciples, and for us. Through His Death and Resurrection, we received the grace to love others as Jesus commanded.


