Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Last Tuesday, we had our annual volunteers' dinner. It was an amazing opportunity for us as a community to thank our many volunteers for the great job they do for us in their different ministries and in the life of our community. As I went around to greet and thank our special volunteers, I was very happy to see the smiles of loving joy radiating from their faces. Every year we use the volunteers' dinner to do two things: to thank our volunteers for the unpayable and unquantifiable gifts they bring to the Kedron Brook Catholic Community (KBCC) and to socialise and connect with other parishioners as companions on the journey. To all our volunteers, Thank you.

### What is Advent?

Advent marks the start of a new liturgical year. Advent means **coming**. It was first used by pagans to herald the coming of their gods. It was also used for the visit of a king to a city or for his coronation. Christians borrowed this word and applied its various meanings to describe the coming of Jesus into the world and to identify specifically the period the church sets aside to prepare for the Christ's visit. The traditional signs of Advent in our Church: violet vestments and hangings, limited decoration (dried flowers or plain green plants) and the Advent wreath, all of them remind us that **we must prepare for the rebirth of Jesus in our hearts and lives, enabling Him to radiate His love, mercy, compassion and forgiveness in and through us.** 

All through Advent, we are invited to meditate on three things about Jesus' coming. Firstly, we reflect on Jesus' first coming as a baby in Bethlehem; secondly, his daily coming into our lives in mystery through the Sacraments, through the Bible, and through the worshipping community; and finally his *Second Coming* (*Parousia*) at the end of the world to reward the just and to punish the wicked.

Last Sunday we were called to wait, to be alert and watch, as we don't know when Jesus Christ will come. On this second Sunday of Advent year B, John the Baptist throws more light on what the Advent season is all about — a time of preparation for the coming of Jesus; but the question is what kind of preparation are we making? It is easier this day and age for many people to focus only on the external and ostentatious preparation, which are all great like: shopping, decorations, end of year parties, arrangement of gifts or even just to show up at the Christmas mass, but then forget the most important preparation, which is the internal and spiritual preparation.

St John the Baptist came as the voice shouting in the wilderness: prepare the way of the Lord and make straight and level every rough and high place. This call for repentance as a way of preparation is indispensable and an integral part of Advent and our life as Christians. Without honest effort towards repentance, my brothers and sisters, we will struggle to reflect Christ and live out the values of love, forgiveness, uprightness and humility.

S. Joseph Krempa put the call for preparation beautifully when he said: "Advent calls us to recalibrate our compass, clean our moral glasses, and reboot our spiritual life by following the Gospel light".

# KBCC Solidarity with the Catholic Parish of St Therese, Kiritimati, Republic of Kiribati

Dear brothers and sisters in the Lord, I would like to inform you that our community, Kedron Brook Catholic Community, has decided to journey in solidarity with the Kiritimati Catholic Parish Project on Kiritimati. This community is one of our closest neighbours in the Pacific region. In a letter from Father Tara-jake Takakia, who looks after the church, the parish is appealing to groups and individuals to support their Parish Project on Ronton Kiritimati. The project is to erect some Eco-friendly single house units or Bungalows (called Little Flower Guest House) over the lagoon in Ronton, which will serve as guest houses for tourists or fish anglers. If this dream is realised, it will be a source of revenue for the Kiritimati Parish Catholic Church. It will also provide employment opportunities to the people who will work as tour guides, boatmen, cleaners, chefs and drivers.

The first phase of the project is to construct the first five units of the "Guest House" estimated to cost \$120,000 AUD. The Catholic Parish in Kiritimati has saved \$20,000 AUD and is seeking interested donors and supporters to come to their aid to make the dream a reality by 2024-2025. As a parish community, our combined Pastoral Council, with the support of the Finance Councils, has agreed to support this endeavour and raise at least \$10,000 AUD in 2024. As a result, all money raised in our Christmas raffles will go to this project. Also, we are looking at other ways of raising the money and would appreciate donations to the Kiritimati appeal fund. *Fr Iheme* 

## **The Season of Advent**

Advent is the traditional season in our Catholic faith to prepare for the arrival of Jesus Christ. The Advent wreath or Advent crown, is used to symbolically commemorate eternal life, death and resurrection of the promised Messiah. The Advent wreath is a Christian tradition that symbolises the passage of four weeks in our Liturgical calendar. The wreath itself is made of various evergreens which signifies newness of life while the circle of the wreath symbolises the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul and the everlasting life we have with Christ. The Advent wreath helps us to spiritually contemplate the great drama of salvation history that surrounds the birth of God incarnate.

The lighting of the Advent wreath is a custom that began in 16th-century Germany among Catholics as well as the Lutherans. The original purpose of the wreath was to bring focus on Christmas rather than on Advent as being a distinct season in the church.

In our Christian tradition, Advent begins on the four Sundays before Christmas Day, or the Sunday which falls closest to November 30, and lasts right through to Christmas Eve, or December 24.

Set on the branches of the Advent wreath are four candles: three purple candles and one pink candle. A more modern tradition has a white candle placed in the centre of the wreath. As a whole, these coloured advent candles represent the coming of the light of Christ into the world.

Each week of Advent on Sunday, a particular Advent candle is lit. In the Catholic tradition, it states that the four candles represent the four weeks of Advent, each stand for one thousand years, to total the 4,000 years from the time of Adam and Eve until the birth of the Saviour.

On the first Sunday of Advent, the first purple candle is lit. This candle is typically called the "Prophecy Candle" in remembrance of the prophets, primarily Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. This first candle represents hope or expectation in anticipation of the coming Messiah.

On the second Sunday of Advent, the second purple candle is lit. This candle represents love. Some traditions call this the "Bethlehem Candle," symbolising Christ's manger. On the third Sunday of Advent the pink, or rose-coloured, candle is lit. This pink candle is usually called the "Shepherds Candle," and it represents joy. This Sunday is also called Gaudete Sunday. The fourth and last purple candle is often called the "Angels Candle," and it represents peace. This is lit on the fourth Sunday of Advent.

On Christmas Eve, the white centre candle is lit. This candle is called the "Christ Candle" and represents the life of Christ that has come into the world. The colour white represents purity. Christ is the sinless, spotless, pure Saviour. Those who receive Christ as Saviour are washed of their sins and made whiter than snow.
