The Banquet To Which We All Are Invited

On this 28th Sunday in the Ordinary Time Year A, we read of the great banquet to which we all are invited. In the first reading from Isaiah 25:6-10a, we read that God will put a great Party on the mountain for all people, a banquet of rich food, and a banquet of juicy fine strained wines. It will be a banquet party of joy, happiness and merriment, because God will wipe the tears from his people's eyes, remove all pain and the mourning veil covering all peoples and nations, and will destroy death forever.

The gospel parable from Matthew 22:1-14 strikes a similar tone with the first

reading too. There is a wedding party that a king provided for his son. Rich food and fine wines were prepared. The difference between the banquets of the first reading and the gospel is that in the first reading all people were invited from the beginning, while in the gospel, few were initially invited, and when they refused, all people were invited to the wedding banquet. The second contrast is that a dress code was given for all attendees in the gospel, but nothing of such in the first reading.

Jesus crafted the parable, highlighting the contrast mentioned to shed light on the special relationship of the Jews with God and how the rejection led to God's extension of the same special relationship to all people of the world.

What are the lessons for us to take from the readings?

Firstly, salvation and God's love are available to all people regardless of life stories, background or deeds. We are all invited to a special loving relationship with God, for the Lord is a God of inclusion. *Secondly*, just like the people in the readings, we sometimes neglect and miss opportunities that call us to attend to divine calls in our lives and to be Christ to

others.

Finally, as the new people of God, it is not just "okay and enough" to show up. We must be prepared, spiritually and mentally, to continually be God's signs of love and compassion in the world. It's a call for hope and for us to keep our eyes on the bigger picture of heavenly union with God – that is the banquet to which we all are invited.

Vatican News

The Vatican Secretary of State, Cardinal Pietro Parolin, expresses the Pope's sorrow for the outbreak of war in the Holy Land, expressing hopes that reason will prevail over violence. In his opening address at a three-day conference starting on Monday at the Pontifical Gregorian University entitled "The New Documents from the Pontificate of Pope Pius XII and their Meaning for Jewish-Christian Relations." Cardinal Parolin said, "I would have never thought to begin, today, my speech with the dutiful, sad obligation to share and convey the sorrow that the Holy Father expressed yesterday at what is happening in Israel. Two days ago, on the day of the Sabbath, on the feast of Simchat Torah, the joy of the Torah, in Israel, many Israeli brothers and sisters were awakened by a terrible and despicable attack. We are close to the families of the victims, to the thousands of wounded, to those who are missing and kidnapped and now in grave danger."...

Foundation for peaceful coexistence in a report from Salvatore Cernuzio:

Just ahead of the event, Cardinal Parolin spoke to journalists outside the Pontifical Gregorian University. He called for a solution that finds ways "to lay the foundation" for addressing the challenge of coexistence between Palestinians and Israelis by implementing "the instruments of diplomacy" that the international community has available. "Until that problem is resolved, until a roadmap for peace is found, these things will always risk repeating themselves and always with greater ferocity," he warned.

Living with justice: Cardinal Parolin finally appealed that, "we must find the conditions that allow us to live with justice," because as Pope Pius XII said in the past "peace is the fruit of justice."... Therefore, we need to "find the way to resolve this tragic problem of relations between Palestinians and Israelis on the basis of justice. WE WILL WANT YOU TO SEND US THE NAMES OF THOSE YOU WANT TO PRAY FOR TO THE PARISH OFFICE BY WEDNESDAY 25TH OCTOBER 2023. This will give the parish staff time to compile the names. The November mass envelope will be available in our churches this weekend and next. Pick up an envelope if you want to request mass and please write the name of the person or persons for whom you want to mass celebrated, and complete the other details on the envelope. If you complete the envelope, you don't need to send any email to the office. To pray for the dead is one of the spiritual works of mercy and the mass as the highest form of prayer, connects the living, the saints, and the dead. Remember, prayer is the only best gift of love that we can give our loved ones who have passed as they cannot pray for themselves. I encourage us to attend the mass too on that day.
