18th February 2024 — Year B — 1st Sunday of Lent

My dear brothers and sisters,

Just few days ago we celebrated Ash Wednesday, and as we were signed with the ashes on our forehead, we were called to "repent and believe the Gospel". With that, the Lenten season, a season of preparation, fasting and prayer was set into motion. Lent commemorates the forty days and forty nights that Jesus spent in the wilderness fasting and praying after His baptism.

As we embark on this sacred journey of Lent, we are drawn into the wilderness alongside Jesus, who was led by the Spirit to face temptation and to prepare for His ministry. The Gospel passage this first Sunday of Lent (from Mark 1:12-15) invites us to reflect deeply on the significance of this season and the spiritual truths it reveals.

In the wilderness, Jesus confronts the allure of worldly power and the temptations of the flesh. For forty days and nights, He fasts and prays, wrestling with the forces of darkness that seek to undermine His mission. Yet, amidst adversity, Jesus emerges victorious, steadfast in His commitment to God's will and the proclamation of the kingdom.

The wilderness experience of Jesus resonates deeply with our own journey through Lent. Like Jesus, we are called to enter into a period of self-examination and spiritual renewal, to confront our own vulnerabilities and the temptations that threaten to lead us astray. Lent provides us with a sacred space to deepen our relationship with God, to purify our hearts, and to realign our priorities with the values of the Gospel.

Central to the message of Lent is the call to repentance and conversion. As Jesus proclaims, "The kingdom of God is at hand; repent, and believe in the Gospel" (Mark 1:15). This call echoes through the ages, inviting us to turn away from sin and embrace the abundant life offered to us through Christ. Repentance is not merely a solemn acknowledgment of wrongdoing, but a transformative act of turning towards God's mercy and grace. It is a journey of reconciliation and healing, where we surrender our brokenness and receive the promise of redemption. In the sacrament of reconciliation, we encounter the boundless mercy of God, who welcomes us with open arms and restores us to wholeness.

As we journey through Lent, let us heed the call to repentance with humble and contrite hearts. Let us embrace the disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving as ways to resist the pull of materialism and power, plus the desire to seek vain glory. Additionally it is a means of drawing closer to God and deepening our commitment to discipleship. Let us walk with Jesus through the wilderness, trusting in His ever-abiding presence and the promise of new life that awaits us on the other side.

May this season of Lent be a time of profound spiritual growth and renewal, as we open our hearts to the transforming power of God's love. May we emerge from the wilderness, strengthened in faith, and ready to proclaim the Good News to all the world. Amen.

#### KBCC Solidarity with the Catholic Parish of St Therese, Kiritimati, Republic of Kiribati

Kiritimati, Republic of Kiribati is one of our closest neighbours in the Pacific region. Father Tara-jake Takakia, who looks after The Catholic Parish of St Therese, is appealing to groups and individuals to support their Parish Project on Ronton Kiritimati.

The project dream is to erect some Eco-friendly single house units or Bungalows (called Little Flower Guest House) over the lagoon in Ronton, which will serve as guest houses for tourists or fish anglers. This dream will be a source of revenue for the Kiritimati Parish Catholic Church. It will also provide employment opportunities to the people who will work as tour guides, boatmen, cleaners, chefs and drivers.

I appeal to our generous parishioners, for the love of God, to help a sister parish in need. Phase one of the project is to construct the first five units of the "Guest House" estimated to cost \$120,000AUD.

The Catholic Parish in Kiritimati has saved \$20,000AUD and is seeking interested donors and supporters to come to their aid to make the dream a reality by 2024-2025. Our combined Pastoral Council, with the support of the Finance Councils, has agreed to support this endeavour and raise at least \$10,000 AUD in 2024.

#### WELL MAY YOU ASK "WHAT IS THE CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD?"

The term 'Children's Liturgy of the Word' refers to the practice of children leaving the Sunday church assembly during the Liturgy of the Word and gathering elsewhere to celebrate a separate Liturgy of the Word that is more appropriate to the children's level of understanding.

Here in our Parish, we gather together children - aged from four years (especially if they have an older sibling) to 12 years - so they can have a special time to understand the gospel with their peers. The children leave the assembly after the opening prayer and process to a separate area to celebrate a liturgy of the word that is more appropriate to their age level. There are adults who accompany the group and, most of the time, these are parents of the children who attend. The adults have a love, and an understanding, of the gospel. Some are teachers, some are retired people who love God's word, some have a good relationship with children and some just simply love serving the community.

Both St Columba's and St John the Baptist celebrate the Children's Liturgy of the Word. St Columba's regularly holds the Children's liturgy of the Word on the  $2^{nd}$  and  $4^{th}$  Sundays of the month, and St John the Baptist every  $4^{th}$  Sunday of the month. When you are at mass with your children, try the Children's Liturgy of the Word. If you would like, you are welcome to accompany the children.

The activities surround the gospel for the day. The Leader (an adult) reads the Gospel from the Children's Lectionary. The children experience the "word" being read to them. They hear the scriptures proclaimed and Explained, and respond in prayer, action and song. That is followed by discussions and questions and specific clarification of the "lesson" of the gospel in children's language, understanding and age level. As far as possible the readings follow those in the Lectionary for Mass but the simplified language is easier for children to understand.

A liturgy of the word is never simply a verbal experience. Just as in adult liturgy, the use of symbol, colour, gesture, movement and singing heightens the children's experience of the scriptures. They do activities in relation to the gospel such as a colouring-in sheet, a game or an art and craft activity.

This is what we provide - a worthy place of celebration, a Lectionary which is attractive and handled with respect, and the scriptures proclaimed well - all this conveys clearly to the children the sacredness of God's word which altogether influence how they accept, grow and live by it.
