19th November 2023—33rd Sunday Ordinary Time—Year A

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The gospel parable of the 33<sup>rd</sup> Sunday Year A, tells us about the Lord's coming again, which will be a time of judgement and accountability. The parable is about three servants (disciples) to whom their master gave talents and went away. On return he called them to give an account on how they used the talents. Two did the needful and traded with what they were given. The third, who got the least, hid his talent and did not do a thing with it. The teaching in the story tells us that it doesn't matter how many talents/gifts they were given (or that we are given today), the important thing was their honest effort and how they used their talents.

Let us look at what the master says of the good effort of the first two servants: "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things; I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness." This is what all of us Christians will want to hear on the last day. But the question is, are we working towards that and are we doing the things that the Lord wants of us? Most times some people do not use their gifts because they are afraid of taking a risk or are lazy. The parable reminds us that that which we don't use, we lose

A wealthy man once melted his hoard of gold into a single lump, which he then secretly buried in his garden under the cover of the night. Every day he went to look at it in admiration when no one was watching him. One day, one of his servants discovered his secret and came by at night and stole the gold. When the man came to check his treasure, he was shocked and heartbroken on discovery that it was not there and had been stolen. He told his friend about his misfortune, but his friend said to him, "don't take it so hard on yourself, just put a large stone in the hole, and look at it every day. You won't be worse off than before. After all, even when you had the gold you never used it".

All of us have been given a gift by God. Each of us has something to offer and can be fruitful with even the small gift we are given. Jesus has told us what God wants and the way to fruitfulness. He said: "If you love me keep my commandments" (Jn. 14:15), and his counsel to us says, whatever you do to the least of my sisters and brothers that you do onto me (Mt. 25: 40). When we listen to Jesus, we will not be moody about the parable of today but will hear with smiles the words of Jesus "Well done, good and faithful servant come into your master's happiness."

Let us not be afraid to take a risk by always playing it safe in our comfort zone. Doing so will only leave us stagnant and lukewarm in faith, which is dangerous, and leads to the slow loss of everything. On the other hand, intentional sowing of the seed of love, using our gifts and carrying our cross after the Lord, being patient, resilient in good works and love draw us closer to the kingdom and into the Lord's happiness.
