

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

4th Sunday of Advent Year B – Mary's YES

Today, the 4th Sunday of Advent, our attention is drawn to the person of the blessed Virgin Mary, her deep faith, trust and shining example of obedience. All these are summed up in her YES to the will of God.

Mary's "Yes" changed the course of history and marked the beginning of the age of Christ, that started with Jesus' birth, God becoming human - Emmanuel, which we will celebrate tomorrow. Before the visitation of angel Gabriel, Mary was living her life as every ordinary Jewish girl. She was among those who were in the lowest level of the social ladder of her time, a commoner, but God chose her to be the mother of God.

Let us not forget that the will of God for Mary came with a kind of disruption and legitimate concern for Mary. Hence the question: How could this come about because I am a virgin? In other words, Mary was worried by the fear of the unknown and the consequences it will have on her and her practice of her religion.

In life we are touched and shaped in different ways by our decisions and the 'yes' we had said in life, for instance, a parent yes to marriage, a yes to a job and to friendship. These sometimes have put people under pressure, pain and challenges and even fear of the unknown and of what the future holds for them. Never the less, regardless of the challenges, we must remain hopeful and, like Mary, trust in God.

The word of God from the Angel: "Do not be afraid is a message of hope, that the light will still shine even from the heart of darkness, confusion and fear." So, do not be afraid of your future. God is still in charge of our affairs both temporary and spiritual. God never abandons his people. Rather, like the Virgin Mary, let us say YES to God and continue to say yes. Remember that God's messengers and voices often times come to us in the needs and voices of one's spouse, children, friends, the poor and the church.

Our prayer is that we will move, everyday of our life, with courage and trust in the word of God beyond fear and despair, and cling to Christ, the Emmanuel - God is with us, who longs to come into our lives and affairs in His own terms, and to bring us His peace, a kind that the world cannot give.

KBCC Solidarity with the Catholic Parish of St Therese, Kiritimati, Republic of Kiribati

Dear brothers and sisters in the Lord, I would like to inform you that our community, Kedron Brook Catholic Community, has decided to journey in solidarity with the Kiritimati Catholic Parish Project on Kiritimati. This community is one of our closest neighbours in the Pacific region. In a letter from Father Tara-jake Takakia, who looks after the church, the parish is appealing to groups and individuals to support their Parish Project on Ronton Kiritimati. The project is to erect some Eco-friendly single house units or Bungalows (called Little Flower Guest House) over the lagoon in Ronton, which will serve as guest houses for tourists or fish anglers. If this dream is realised, it will be a source of revenue for the Kiritimati Parish Catholic Church. It will also provide employment opportunities to the people who will work as tour guides, boatmen, cleaners, chefs and drivers.

The first phase of the project is to construct the first five units of the "Guest House" estimated to cost \$120,000 AUD. The Catholic Parish in Kiritimati has saved \$20,000 AUD and is seeking interested donors and supporters to come to their aid to make the dream a reality by 2024-2025. As a parish community, our combined Pastoral Council, with the support of the Finance Councils, has agreed to support this endeavour and raise at least \$10,000 AUD in 2024. As a result, all money raised in our Christmas raffles will go to this project. Also, we are looking at other ways of raising the money and would appreciate donations to the Kiritimati appeal fund. *Fr Iheme*
