24h March 2024 — Year B — Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Today marks the solemn occasion of Palm Sunday, heralding the commencement of Holy Week.

On this day, we are called to reflect upon the life of Jesus and, above all, His profound humility and submission to the will of God, because He willingly sacrificed Himself for our redemption. It beckons us to introspective pondering on who we are and are called to be, as well as on the paths we are summoned to tread. As Christians, our faith must remain resolute, anchored steadfastly in hope, and resilient against the onslaught of fear and despair.

The Gospel passage for the procession of the palms from Mark 11:1-10 recounts Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, where adoring crowds greeted Him with shouts of "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the kingdom of our father David that is coming! Hosanna in the highest!" and threw palm branches in His path. However, juxtaposed against this jubilation were the apprehensive Jewish leaders, who perceived Jesus as a threat to their authority and status quo, and who therefore made themselves barefaced enemies of Jesus. They watched as the crowd was animated in their admiration of Jesus the Messiah, laying their cloths and palm fronds on the road, an equivalent of a "red carpet reception" today. They understood what was happening as the crowds proclaimed: "Hosanna to the Son of David." Hence, the readings for Passion Sunday focus the sacrifice which Jesus Christ made for you and me.

In the first reading (Is. 50:4-7), prophet Isaiah foretells Jesus' suffering. He prophesied of the suffering servant who did not hide his face from shame, who gave his back to those who struck him and his cheek to those who pulled out his beard. In the psalm, we hear the heart-wrenching cry that Jesus prayed from the cross: "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me". In the second reading from Philippians 2:8b-9, St Paul tells us that Jesus humbled Himself though He was in the form of God. This He did for our sake and for our salvation.

Dear brothers and sisters, we must heed the cautionary tale embedded within this narrative. The same throngs that hailed Jesus as a Saviour soon faltered when His teachings challenged their preconceptions. Their fickle allegiance turned to condemnation, because they placed expectations upon divine providence. They wanted a "Jesus" who will follow them. So, because Jesus did not conform to their narrow visions of liberation, they turned against Him.

Nevertheless, amidst the cruelty and betrayal, Jesus exemplified unparalleled grace and love. His outstretched arms upon the cross epitomise forgiveness and reconciliation, even in the face of unfathomable suffering. His plea, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do," encapsulates the boundless mercy of God.

In our own lives, we too change often between unwavering faith and faltering doubt, especially when confronted with adversity. Yet, like Jesus, we are called to embody humility, serving others with selfless love and making sacrifices for the greater good and the salvation of souls.

As Holy Week unfolds, may it imbue us with renewed faith, hope and inner peace, even amidst a fractured world. May we journey alongside Jesus through His passion, and emerge with hearts ablaze in the glorious light of Easter. Amen.

The annual collection for the support of the church in the Holy Land will take place on Good Friday, March 29th. This collection promotes the missionary work of the Church in the Holy Land by providing welfare assistance to local Christians in areas such as health, education, employment, housing. Parishes, and orphanages. It is also used to maintain over 70 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus. Due to the ongoing war, the Church and people of the Holy Land are still struggling with reduced income due to fewer pilgrims and lower church attendance around the world. In 2023 Australian Catholics were once again extremely generous and we were able to send to the Holy Land nearly \$1.4 million [\$1.4 million (2022), \$1,126,098 (2021), \$406,023 (2020) and \$1.3 million (2019)]. The reality for the Holy Land mission is that they will continue to face challenges financial and spiritual and so we again ask Catholics around the world to be as generous as possible, with their financial support as well as the spiritual support. Please remember the Christians of the Holy Land on Good Friday. **Thank you**.

Where to send the collection: All cash should be sent to the person responsible for the financial affairs of your Diocese. Please assist by sending it promptly. The Commissariat then receives a cheque or bank transfer from your Diocese once most returns have been received.

Please note: All credit card offerings (made on the back of the Holy Land Collection envelopes) and all personal cheques made out to the Holy Land Commissariat should be sent directly to the Commissariat office within one month (Holy Land Commissariat, Franciscan Provincial Office 47 Victoria Street, Waverley NSW 2024). Offerings received in this way will be added to the final amount from your parish and you will be advised of this amount in writing.

Some parishes may choose to remit their collection directly to the Commissariat by cheque (payable to "Holy Land Commissariat"), at the address above, or by electronic transfer. The money is banked immediately into the Commissariat account and a receipt is issued by the Commissariat office.
