#### **Journeying with Christ: Embracing Transformation**

As we reflect upon the Word of God on this Second Sunday of Lent, we are called to embark on a spiritual journey with Jesus, just as Peter, James and John did on Mount Tabor. In the readings, we encounter the theme of transformation - a transformation that requires us to embrace faith, surrender and hope amidst the trials of life.

In the first reading from the Book of Genesis, we are reminded of Abraham's unwavering faith and trust in God's promise. Despite the uncertainty and challenges he faced, Abraham obeyed God's call to leave his homeland and journey to a new land. His faith teaches us to trust in God's providence, even when the path ahead seems unclear.

The Gospel passage presents the transfiguration of Jesus in front of Peter, James and John. Jesus reveals His divine glory, offering them a glimpse of the heavenly kingdom. This profound experience underscores the importance of prayer and contemplation in our journey of faith. Like the disciples, we are invited to draw closer to Jesus through prayer, allowing His light to illuminate our hearts and minds. Besides, the transfiguration narrative foreshadows Jesus' Paschal mystery - His suffering, death and resurrection. It reminds us that true transformation often requires us to embrace the cross.

Lent invites us to reflect on our own crosses and struggles, trusting that through our trials, God is working to bring about new life and redemption. In every step of our lives, God is there to shepherd us, despite the challenges around us. St Paul captures this beautifully in the second reading, Romans 8:31b-34 - "If God is for us, no one and nothing can stand against us". If you think about it, these words echo through the ages, and have offered solace and strength to many who faced, and to many who are facing, adversity and uncertainty today.

Journeying with God involves making the words "For if God is for us, who can be against us?" the corner stone of our faith. In our darkest moments, when the storms of life threaten to overwhelm us, we can find courage in the knowledge that God stands with us, guiding us through the storm. Faithfully accepting these words transforms us in a way that the outside world is unable to provide.

As we continue our Lenten journey, let us heed the words of Jesus (Mt. 17:7): "Rise, and do not be afraid." Let us rise above our doubts and fears, placing our trust in God's unfailing love and mercy. May this season of Lent be a time of spiritual renewal and transformation, where we open our hearts to God's grace and allow His light to shine brightly within us as we journey towards the joy of Easter. Amen.

#### Lent is 40 days

Lent is a period of <u>penitential preparation for Easter</u> in Christianity. It begins on Ash Wednesday and lasts for 40 days, in imitation of Jesus Christ's fast in the wilderness. During Lent, Christians focus on <u>fasting</u>, <u>prayer</u>, <u>and almsgiving</u>. It is a period of reflection and preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. Where Easter celebrates the resurrection of Jesus after his death on the cross, Lent recalls the events leading up to and including Jesus' crucifixion.

Christian churches that observe Lent in this century (not all do) use it as a time for prayer and penance. Very few people today fast for the whole of Lent, although some continue to practice fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. It is more common these days for believers to surrender a particular "indulgent habit" such as eating favourite foods like chocolate or perhaps smoking. Many of us fast and deny ourselves of certain social activities or withdraw from excesses and other indulgent habits to replicate Christ's fasting and withdrawal into the desert. Whatever the sacrifice, it is a reflection of Jesus' deprivation in the wilderness and a test of self-discipline.

The six Sundays of the Lenten season are seen as a unity. The usual liturgical colours for the first three Sundays are purple or Lenten array (red, black and calico). Purple is used for two reasons: firstly, because it is associated with mourning and so anticipates the pain and suffering of the crucifixion, and secondly because purple is the colour associated with royalty, and celebrates Christ's resurrection and sovereignty. In the middle of the Lenten season, the church colours shift to *pink*. The third Sunday, known as *Gaudete Sunday*, celebrates the halfway point of Lent and emphasises rejoicing in the anticipation of Easter; and it changes back to purple until Palm Sunday. The Sunday of the Passion (Palm Sunday) colour again changes from purple to red without the Pentecost symbols, and it can be appropriate for red to remain through to Good Friday. So, during our Lenten journey, we wear purple as a reminder of our need for redemption, and on those special Sundays, a touch of pink reminds us of the coming celebration of Christ's resurrection.

During Lent, we take stock of our lives. A sort of "tidying up" of behaviour that leads us away from Christ. As part of this spiritual self-reflection, we pray and repent for our sins and focusing on our mortality and dependence on God. Many Christians give alms or volunteer their time during Lent as a way of following Jesus' command to love others as ourselves (Matthew 22:39). Lent is also a time of renewal in which we take steps to recommit ourselves to Christ and to pave the triumphant way for Easter.
