I am the Vine and You are the Branches

Many times over, life's experiences teach us that as members of a community, we need one another, other living beings, people, animals, nature, the air, the skies, even the distant past. The gospel reading reminds us that as baptised Christians we are not just intimately linked but that the source of our unity is the Risen Christ. We are parts of the same tree, same vine, we just cannot survive on our own isolated patch in this world.

Today's Gospel reading is taken from middle of the Last Supper discourse. Jesus speaks about His relationship to His disciples. In His metaphor of the vine and the branches, Jesus is speaking in reference to the Hebrew Scriptures. In the Hebrew Scriptures, Israel is the vineyard, and God Himself is the vinedresser. One of the primary themes of John's Gospel is to show Jesus to be the fulfilment of God's promises to Israel.

Again, in this passage, Jesus teaches His disciples that His relationship with them will not end after His death; He will remain with them always. Jesus exhorts the disciples repeatedly to "remain" in Him. This unity between Jesus and His disciples is the basis for their ability to continue to do the work that He began. Similarly, Jesus' presence with us through the Gift of the Holy Spirit enables us to continue the work of love and reconciliation that He began.

Then this is what it means to us even to this day. Jesus also taught His disciples about the importance of the words He used in teaching life's lessons to them. Just as Jesus remained in the disciples, so too did His words. And so will it be for us ... right now in this place and in this time! The way we come to know Jesus is through the Scriptures, the living Word of God. Therefore, the way by which the disciples were sustained by Christ's teachings applies to us too. Our commitment to be Christ's disciples is sustained through God's Word. This commitment is definitely strengthened by our life of prayer and nourished by the Eucharist. It is through the Eucharist that Jesus dwells in us, remains with us, and transforms us so that we might bear fruit in His name. Jesus makes it clear to His disciples that they can only bear fruit when there is a flow of life from vine to branches, from Him to His believers. The counterpoint to this fruitful life is the need for pruning and cleansing. Withered branches are cast off and living ones are trimmed.

The primary emphases throughout this passage are mutuality, fruitfulness and divine initiative. John is inviting his readers to take Jesus' words to heart and to dwell on them. What does this mean for us ... we have to continue to be fed and nourished by Jesus' words and His teachings. We have to be sustained by His Body and Blood through our connection with the mass and the sacraments. We know of others or maybe we have observed people who act in ways that show their commitment to serve their neighbour. In addition to witnessing and hearing about the selfless service rendered by individuals to their neighbourhood and beyond, we also establish connections by serving God through others! Many Christians and non-Christians alike go out to feed the hungry, care for the sick, shelter the homeless, visit the imprisoned, and give alms to the poor. These actions become acts of Christian discipleship ... especially when they are motivated by our relationship with Jesus. Whatever the immediate results, Jesus promises us that these actions will bear fruit when we undertake them in His name.



Archdiocese of Brisbane Mass Attendance Count
