#### LOVE, The Greatest of the Commandments

Every society in the world has legal codes and laws guiding the way of life, rights, and people's responsibilities. So, it was in the time of Jesus. Prior to Jesus' birth, the laws (commandments) had become a source of concern and burden to the extent that the majority of them were unknown to most people. Over the years, due to the multiplicity of the laws, the Jews have discussed which of the commandments is the greatest of the laws. No Rabbi prior to Jesus had ever synthesised the

commandments in simple terms. That was why the question was put before Jesus in today's gospel. However, one thing to note here is that they did not come in good faith to ask Jesus the question. The gospel says the Pharisees, to disconcert Jesus, put the question to Him: "Master, which is the greatest commandment of the law?" The word Matthew used in Greek is "*Ekpeirazon*" = "try to trap" "to put to the test" (to disconcert). They wanted Jesus to say something that they could use against Him. This is a similar concept to that from last Sunday's gospel, with the question of the lawfulness of paying taxes to Caesar.

In response to their question, Jesus points to two commandments. The first is from Deuteronomy 6:4 (the *Schema*- Here O Israel), "You must love the Lord your God with everything about you (heart, soul and mind)". As they thought "yes, we know", Jesus brought in the surprise. The second is this: "You must love your neighbour as yourself" - Leviticus 19:18. By putting them together Jesus is emphasising their essential relatedness and how they are intrinsically linked. Thus, the summary of the commandments is LOVE, because God is Love (1 John 4:16).

The word "Love" has Greek roots, and the Greeks have three main ways by which they express love: *EROS, PHILIA and AGAPE*. In our world today, when people talk of love, it generally revolves around "Eros" (passionate love between a young man and woman) and "Philia" (love of close friends). These two forms of love are incomplete because they are tainted and driven by emotion, benefits, and reward. The purpose of getting something in return is at their core.

When the Greeks thought about the actions and life of Jesus, they saw something that they had never known before. So, they called it AGAPE or selfless love. This third kind of love is the most radical, deepest, and highest form of love. It is a completely self-sacrificing love, a love that lacks self-interest, self-gratification, and self-preservation. This kind of love influences us to act in the way God calls us to live and treat others.

Dear friends, Jesus calls us to love completely (with all our heart, soul, and mind) for it is the first and greatest commandment, and then to show that love in action towards all people. St Paul, in 1 Cor.13:4-7, describes this love as patient, kind, not envious, not boastful, not proud, not rude, not self-seeking, not unforgiving, it keeps no record of wrongs, but rejoices in the truth, it loves hopes and protects and never fails. **This love looks upwards and around.** Agape is what Jesus commands us to give to one another today. "A new commandment I give to you, *Love one another as I have loved you*" (John 13:35). This love, though connected with emotion and feeling, is ruled and influenced by what is good. God bless you.
