

3rd December 2023—1st Sunday of Advant—Year B

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This Sunday we begin our journey of Advent and the start of a new liturgical year (B). Advent means **coming**. It was first used by pagans to herald the coming of their gods. It was also used for the visit of a king to a city or for his coronation. Christians borrowed this word and applied its various meanings to describe the coming of Jesus into the world and to identify specifically the period the church sets aside to prepare for the Christ's visit.

This Sunday and all through Advent, we are invited to meditate on three things about Jesus' coming. Firstly, we reflect on Jesus' first coming as a baby in Bethlehem, secondly, his daily coming into our lives in mystery through the Sacraments, through the Bible, and through the worshipping community, and finally his *Second Coming (Parousia)* at the end of the world to reward the just and to punish the wicked.

The traditional signs of Advent in our Church: violet vestments and hangings, limited decoration (dried flowers or plain green plants) and the Advent wreath, all of them remind us that we must prepare for the rebirth of Jesus in our hearts and lives, enabling him to radiate his love, mercy, compassion, and forgiveness in and through us.

In the opening of the gospel Jesus admonishes us "Be on your guard, stay awake;" towards the end Jesus repeated "So stay awake, because you do not know when the Lord of the house is coming, whether in the evening, or at midnight, or at dawn, or in the morning. May he not come suddenly and find you sleeping." Mark 13:35-36. Staying awake and being watchful has deep meaning. It means being focussed and observant. It means that I must constantly keep a keen eye on the signs and signals that indicate Jesus' presence around me or His teachings, love, and His call for me to live a life of faith. This is because when we are intentionally awake and watchful, we will be able to recognize the opportunities to grow in faith and closer to Him in obedience and love for others.

Staying awake can take any of these two forms: staying awake doing good things, like Jesus in Mt. 26:39, Noah, Paul in Acts 16:25 and the disciples in Acts 12:6-14 praying for Peter. OR one can stay awake doing bad and evil like most people did in Noah's time or the enemy planting weed in the farm while the owner was asleep Mt. 13:24-27. Saint Augustine gives us a good recipe on to await: "live your life as you would like your death to be". If we await with love, God will satisfy our heart and our hopes.

Benedict XVI explains that "To watch means to follow the Lord, to choose what He has chosen, to love what He has loved, and to conform one's own life to His". Then the Son of Man will come... and the Father will embrace us for resembling his Son. May the Lord's coming find us awake in doing good things in the service of God and humanity. Amen.



KBCC Solidarity with the Catholic Parish of St Therese, Kiritimati, Republic of Kiribati

Dear brothers and sister in the Lord, I would like to inform you that our community, Kedron Brook Catholic Community, has decided to journey in solidarity with the Kiritimati Catholic Parish Project on Kiritimati. This community is one of our closest neighbours in the Pacific region. In a letter from Father Tara-jake Takakia, who looks after the church, the parish is appealing to groups and individuals to support their Parish Project on Ronton Kiritimati. The project is to erect some Eco-friendly single house units or Bungalows (called Little Flower Guest House) over the lagoon in Ronton, which will serve as guest houses for tourists or fish anglers. If this dream is realised, it will be a source of revenue for the Kiritimati Parish Catholic Church. It will also provide employment opportunities to the people who will work as tour guides, boatmen, cleaners, chefs and drivers.

At my recent visit to the Island, I saw the level of poverty among the people who also carry the financial burden of supporting their church through levies (taxes) frequently imposed by the parish to cover the cost of running and maintaining the parish. I appeal to our generous parishioners, for the love of God, to help a sister parish in need.

The first phase of the project is to construct the first five units of the "Guest House" estimated to cost \$120,000 AUD. The Catholic Parish in Kiritimati has saved \$20,000 AUD and is seeking interested donors and supporters to come to their aid to make the dream a reality by 2024-2025. As a parish community, our combined Pastoral Council, with the support of the Finance Councils, has agreed to support this endeavour and raise at least \$10,000 AUD in 2024. As a result, all money raised in our Christmas raffles will go to this project. Also, we are looking at other ways of raising the money and would appreciate donations to the Kiritimati appeal fund.
