My beloved brothers and sisters,

Today, we exclaim with joy: Hallelujah! Christ is Risen! This day, ordained by the Lord, fills our hearts with gladness as we rejoice in the triumph of light over darkness, and the defeat of death by the resurrection of Jesus Christ. His rising from the dead marks the fulfilment of His earthly mission—a mission of salvation and reconciliation with the Father. According to the gospel reading today, we warm to the revelation from the angel:

"Do not be amazed! You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Behold the place where they laid him. But go and tell his disciples and Peter, "He is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him, as he told you." Mark 16:6-7.

Imagine for a moment if Christ had not risen. He would have been remembered merely as a great social reformer, a challenger of authority, perhaps even relegated to the status of legend. However, Jesus did rise from the dead. By His resurrection He proved that He is more than a legend, a great man, and more than a prophet. By rising from the dead, He has manifested and revealed definitively that He is the Messiah, the Saviour and the Life. Jesus' death and resurrection do not only reconcile us with the Father and delivere us from the death of sin; through His resurrection He has freed us from sin, given us life of grace and the hope of eternal life. His resurrection is the reason we are Christians and why we talk about the faith we have in Him.

The apostle Paul succinctly articulates the significance of Christ's resurrection in 1 Corinthians 15:14-23. He asserts that if Christ had not risen, our preaching would be in vain, our faith futile, and we would remain in our sins. But thanks be to God that Christ rose indeed, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. In Him, all is made alive.

Even before His death, Jesus foretold His resurrection to His disciples, affirming Himself as the Resurrection and the Life. He cautioned against deception and assured that His words would endure despite the passing of heaven and earth.

As we gather to celebrate this unparalleled event in human history, we are called to embrace our identity as Easter people—living in the light of Christ's resurrection every day. To be Easter people means rejecting the culture of death and the mentality of this age that exults death and disrespects life as well as the self-defeating moral relativism that pervades our world. It also means aligning with the truth of Christ and living according to His teachings.

Let the joy of Christ's resurrection permeate your hearts and fill your lives with His boundless love. May this Easter season inspire us to a deeper conversion, an unwavering faith, and a stronger trust that Christ will return and reward everyone according to their works.

As we proclaim: Hallelujah! Christ is Risen! Let us walk in the light of His resurrection and share His love with all we encounter. Amen.
