3rd March 2024 — Year B — 3rd Sunday of Lent

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

From this Sunday until the 5th Sunday of Lent, we will be reading year A instead of our usual Year B readings. This is because, in our community, we have some "elects" on their journey to full initiation into the Catholic Church. When such is the case in a parish, the church advises that it is most appropriate for readings of the 3rd, 4th and 5th Sundays of Lent to come from "Year A". This then coincides with the time of the Scrutinies of the Catechumens.

Today, as we delve into an interesting long story from the Gospel of John 4:5-42, we see the profound encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well. Hungry from a long journey, the disciples went into town to buy food, while Jesus remained by the well. Then at an unusual hour of the day the Samaritan woman approached. Historians and theologians suggest that her timing may have been due to the bad name she had in the community, likely stemming from her life choices and broken relationships.

The woman sought water, but her thirst ran deeper than mere physical need; it was a thirst born of the absence of God in her life. In encountering Jesus, she received the life-changing gift of living water - a deep friendship with the Messiah. This encounter transformed her life, restoring her dignity and leading her to become a missionary to her community, as she proclaimed to her people, "Come and see a man who told me everything I have ever done!"

In every gathering as people of faith, we unite around stories meant to guide, correct and inspire us on our journey of faith (2 Timothy 3:16-17). The plight of the Samaritan woman mirrors the discontent of the Jews in the first reading. As humans, we yearn for health, love, support, understanding and connection. When these thirsts remain unquenched, it often leads to despair, isolation and emotional pain.

Yet, the good news is that Jesus shares in our thirst, longing for our souls to be united with Him. We discover our true fulfilment in God, much as the woman at the well, and as St Augustine so famously said, "You have made us for Yourself, Oh Lord, and our hearts are restless until they find their rest in You".

Are you feeling isolated, rejected, unloved, or longing for material possessions and human approval? These desires cannot satisfy the deeper thirst for God. Instead, when we seek Jesus, He transforms us and offers us the water of life - His peace. God always takes the initiative, beckoning us to drink from the spring of life. Jesus' presence at the well before the woman's arrival was no coincidence; it was a demonstration of God's benevolence and love, meeting us where we are and lifting us up.

The readings assure us that in every human thirst and its effects, God reveals Himself as loving, caring, and even more eager for our souls than we can comprehend. When we come to Jesus, He reveals our emptiness but does not abandon us there. Instead, He teaches us how to fill the void, not from external sources, but from within. It begins with acknowledging our need for Jesus, His care, and sometimes His correction to foster spiritual growth. As we reflect on this encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan woman, may we

be inspired to seek the living water that He offers, knowing that in Him, our deepest thirsts find their true satisfaction.



#### St Patrick's Day - Invitation to Mass

As St Patrick's Day falls on a Sunday this year, the Mass of the Feast of St Patrick will be celebrated on Monday 18 March instead. The Mass on the 17<sup>th</sup> will be of that of the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent and liturgically has precedence. However, we, of the St Patrick's Day Parade Association who have organised the Mass on St Patrick's Day for some years now, nevertheless wish to acknowledge St Patrick's Day and so we invite you to the 10:00am Mass this year in St Stephen's Cathedral on the 17<sup>th</sup> and join fellow members of the Irish Community in celebrating Ireland's National Day. While the Mass itself will not have the same "Irish" input as in previous years, it is still an opportunity to come together and pray for the well-being of all us in the Irish diaspora. And we will still give you the opportunity to meet up with new and old friends afterwards over the tea/coffee refreshments that we will provide. Also put in your diary that the Annual St Patrick's Day Parade will take place in the City on Saturday 16 March starting at 10:30am.



Many RCIA teams and many more catechumens gathered at St Stephen's Cathedral for the Rite of Election on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Lent. Our group gathered at the Cathedral to celebrate with our RCIA Catechumens and Candidates - all 10 of them. This is one of the rituals in the RCIA that is included in the initiation process. The main reason for us performing this rite is to acknowledge the Church's admittance of the catechumens and the blessing of the candidates who have made the choice to be Catholic. Another of the purposes of the rite is to introduce the catechumens to the Archbishop. It was to impress upon the catechumens that they are joining the Catholic Church, which is made up of many, many parishes — not just their home parish. Moreover, the Rite of Election is viewed as the catechumens' final choice to be baptised — a big public declaration that they

have finally decided to sign up, literally. Their names are called out in the ceremony and they sign their names in the Book of the Elect. These are the dominant themes we see in the Rite of Election: the Candidates, who are invited to attend with their Sponsors, meet the Archbishop, are welcomed to the larger church, and make public their decision to become Catholic.

The RCIA catechumens and candidates have now entered into the period of Enlightenment and Purification. It is a time of reflection, intensely centred on conversion, marked by the celebration of scrutinies and presentations and the preparation for the rites on Holy Saturday.

Please let us pray for our Elect and our Candidates that they may continue to ponder God's word, to strengthen their life of prayer and to reject what is displeasing and contrary to God's ways.
