Are You Willing to Act and Live as An Authentic Disciple? "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." (Matthew 16: 21-27)

Think about this statement for a while. Does it not sound frightening? Looking at the first reading you see prophet Jeremiah expressing his anguish, frustration and despair as a result of the attacks and rejection directed at him because of his prophetic ministry. He lamented: "O Lord, you have deceived me..., for the word of the Lord has become for me a reproach and derision all day long," (Jer. 20:7-9).

In the first and gospel readings, we see two pictures that show that life is not a bed of roses neither is the call to follow Jesus going to be a kind of "Eldorado" where everything is fine, without stress and so beautiful. These are crosses in our lives in one way or the other. The gospel shows that, as Christians, we are called to a radical discipleship. The call to radical discipleship demands that we must look beyond the challenges of life and faith and focus on the glory that lies hidden in the cross. Even in real life experiences we know that nothing good comes so easy. To pluck a rose flower, one must get past the thorns in the rose tree. Every achievement and growth in life demands effort and sacrifice, so is the race for heaven.

The Cross is a sign of love that promises hope and life. The cross comes to us in different ways and sizes. We deal with crosses in our day-to-day life. For young people, crosses in life can be that time you are tempted to avoid helping a friend, a brother or sister to get by with the homework when Netflix or our favorite game or show is on and beckoning us. Sacrificing the personal pleasure due to love of helping someone out and doing the right things instead of choosing that which is easy is being an authentic disciple and carrying the cross.

One Christian virtue everyone needs at challenging times is courage. Being courageous is the ability to embrace the struggles and the fears that surround one with the believe that we have a God who never fails anyone who trust in Him.

The gospel invites us to be courageous to lose that which is in us that alienates us from the gospel and love of Jesus. It challenges us to stand for our Christians convictions and values even when it causes us stress and makes us uncomfortable. So what do we get from carrying our crosses? It is the hope of an unimaginable reward that awaits anyone who did not lose faith in Jesus and who goes out of one's way to put smiles on the faces of others. Let us take to heart the admonitions of St Paul "Do not be conformed to this world but be transformed by the renewal of your mind to what is good and acceptable and perfect".



The proposed Indigenous Voice to Parliament

Background to the Uluru Statement from the Heart and proposed Indigenous Voice to Parliament Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples have lived in this land for many thousands of years, their cultural and spiritual connection to country expressed through their history, music, language, songs, art and dancing. Their custodianship is not recognised in the Australian Constitution, and a constitutionally enshrined Indigenous Voice to Parliament is proposed as a way to achieve this. This proposal was requested by those who gathered at Uluru and presented the Uluru Statement from the Heart in 2021. The Uluru Statement has been endorsed by all levels of Catholic leadership, including the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference and His Grace Archbishop Mark Coleridge.

What can you do? Please prayerfully consider your own position

<u>Archbishop Mark certainly acknowledges that every Catholic should and will come to their own conclusions about their re-</u> sponse to social issues such as this one. His statements on matters such as this are made in order to encourage the Catholic community to reflect on the Church's views on specific issues, not to mandate their response. The Archbishop fully respects that you will form your own conscience and make your own decision regarding this referendum.

All Catholics are urged to engage in the debate productively, respecting each other and accepting that people may, in good faith, have differing concerns and perspectives.

Another important step you can take is to read the information available for both sides of the debate so that you can make your own informed decision on how you might vote in the referendum. The conversations about reconciliation are sometimes difficult and there are many considerations in this complex situation. Please also remember our Indigenous brothers and sisters in prayer during this time.
