Dear Sisters and Brothers,

As we gather on this fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B, we reflect on the profound call to discipleship and the transformative power of God's word in our lives. In today's Gospel, Mark 1:29-39, we witness Jesus actively engaging in the ministry of healing and preaching, revealing the depth of His divine mission and the urgency of spreading the Good News.

As the divine physician, Jesus moves among the people reaching out to the broken, the sick, and the marginalised. His ministry is one of mercy, compassion, love and restoration. In His actions, we see the very heart of God, overflowing with love and concern for all humanity. As disciples of Christ we are called to emulate His example, to be instruments of healing and reconciliation in our broken world.

Jesus emphasises the importance of proclaiming the Kingdom of God and inviting others to share in its blessings. He challenges us to be bold witnesses of the Gospel, to let our light shine before others, so they may see our good deeds and glorify our heavenly Father. Our faith is not meant to be hidden away but rather shared and lived out in our daily lives.

In the first reading, Job 7:1-7, we encounter the prophet Job, who notwithstanding his enormous suffering and afflictions, remains steadfast in his faith and trust in God. Job's unwavering belief serves as a powerful reminder that even in the midst of trials and our darkest moments, God is present, offering comfort, strength and hope to those who call upon Him (Heb. 13:5).

Today, as we gather around the table of the Lord, may we be nourished by the Word and the Eucharist, so that we may go forth renewed in spirit and purpose. Brothers and sisters, let us heed the call to discipleship, embracing the mission entrusted to us by Christ Himself. May we be agents of healing, ambassadors of hope, and bearers of the Good News to all whom we encounter.

Let us also strive to live out our faith with courage and conviction, knowing that God's grace is sufficient for us, and His power is made perfect in our weakness (2 Cor. 12). May the Holy Spirit, the Lord of the journey guide and empower us as we travel forth, proclaiming the Kingdom of God and building a world rooted in love, justice and peace. Amen.

Celebrating the 1st Rite of Reconciliation in our Parish

In Term One, we have our year 5s being invited to come and celebrate the 1st Rite of Reconciliation. Firstly, the parents receive information about the Sacrament and how it is celebrated in our Parish. Sometimes parents have a different picture of the 1st Rite of Reconciliation or perhaps they have memories of their own first Confession or they haven't been to confession for a while such that they are not in touch with the changes to Reconciliation and how it is celebrated these days.

The 1st Rite of Reconciliation is celebrated by an individual in the presence of the priest. A Reconciliation Room is usually the place where this takes place. This Rite of Reconciliation starts off with the Liturgy of the Word, which is followed by the Liturgy of Reconciliation. The priest helps the child (penitent) confess his or her sins and then offers suitable advice or counsel. The priest reminds him/her of Jesus' saving death and resurrection. After confession the priest gives the child an act of penance which the child accepts as a sign of his/her repentance and inner conversion. As far as possible the penance corresponds to the nature of the sin. It may take the form of prayer, perhaps some self-denial or even some works of mercy. Doing works of mercy shows, and makes the child realise, that sin and its forgiveness have a social aspect.

The priest will ask the child to pray the Prayer of Sorrow (which is given at the workshop or at the Liturgy). The priest then extends his hands over the penitent's head and says the words of absolution. Next is a prayer of praise for God's mercy, followed by the dismissal, when the priest says: "The Lord has freed you from your sins. Go in peace."

The children and families are fully supported by the parish through instruction and preparation materials and resources. The programme is explained in detail and the families are guided throughout the programme step by step. Those involved become devoted and self-assured when it comes to knowing and understanding genuine repentance for the bad choices and sins committed and are at ease in doing so. As a result, the children feel prepared and unafraid to participate in the programme.
