# "As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world"

Unlike the days of Jesus' time, we have better lighting and electricity systems in the world that make our life comfortable. Even at night our cities are well illuminated. So, what is Jesus talking about in the gospel when he said: "As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world." The above words of Jesus have a far reaching message and implication in our lives and relationships with God. It is one of the seven "I am" sayings of Jesus that St John Gospel describes as signs.

The Aim of the John's gospel: In his gospel, St John wanted, above all, to shed light on the divine and deep mysteries about Jesus. His gospel is totally different from the three synoptic gospels: Matthew, Mark and Luke, who recorded many of Jesus' miracles in their Gospels. But John chose to record only seven miracles. He called them signs. The miracles in St John's gospel gave evidence that Jesus is the Messiah and the Son of God. Additionally, John emphasised that Jesus was also human, who, like us, became tired and hungry (Jn 4:6 - 31), angry at the people who were doing business in the Temple (Jn 2:15), sad and even wept when his friend Lazarus died (Jn 11:35). Last Sunday John presented Jesus who was thirsty (Jn 4:5-42). John's gospel captured Jesus as completely human and completely God.

The Message from the Healing: In the ancient Hebrew world view, "light" represents both knowledge and morality. This is one of the reasons Scripture uses blindness as a spiritual metaphor. We see this in Jesus' words in the gospel "For judgement I came to this world, that those who do not see may see... if you were blind, you would have no guilt; but now that you say, 'we see', your guilt remains," (Jn 9:41). Jesus said this to the pharisees because of their darkness of heart that bred pride, jealousy, hatred, and ultimately rejection of Him. Those who are "spiritually blind" reject God, making it literally impossible for them to perceive His truth. A step back to the preceding chapter (Jn 8:12): Jesus had already proclaimed "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the light of faith." With these words Jesus revealed to us His power and willingness to do for our moral world what the sun does for the physical world. He intends to bring into our world - life, the living water that nourishes faith, love, beauty, and rekindles joy, and hope. Light is defined as life, as seen in John 1:4, "In Him was life; and the life was the light of men (people)". Those who have faith through Him will have eternal life.

However, for Jesus to be our light and life, we must wholeheartedly let Him in. We must avoid the spiritual and moral blindness of the Pharisees that threw them into full darkness. Their blindness led them to see Jesus as an opponent to hate instead of a saviour. It led them to self-centred lives, and oppression of the poor (Mt 23:3-4, 23-25, 34), rather than to a loving service.

My dear friends, Jesus, the light, is among us, we must let Him in because to all who receive and believe in Him are given the power to be children of God (Jn1:12). As we continue our Lenten journey, may our hearts be open to Jesus, that we may grow in faith and see not only with our eyes but also with our hearts what the Lord wants of us, and have the spiritual courage to act accordingly and have nothing to do with the futile works of darkness (Ephesians 5:10-11).

Thu lives in Vietnam. When Thu was 12 years old, he stepped on an unexploded land mine and lost his leg.

Living with a disability in rural Vietnam presented many challenges for Thu, who worked mainly as a rice farmer. Thu also took on the role of caring for his wife, Linh, after she suffered a stroke.

Determined to turn their lives around, Thu and Linh joined the Empowerment of People with Disabilities program, run by Caritas Australia's local partner in Vietnam, the Centre for Sustainable Rural Development (SRD).

For Thu, the greatest impact the program has had is enabling the change in Linh's physical and mental wellbeing. With the support of a physiotherapist, Linh can now walk short distances with the aid of a walking stick.
