"COME OUT"

Today's readings confront us with the reality of death, though not primarily our physical death, but the death we all experience in our souls and the despair that oftentimes overpowers us and makes us like "walking dead," especially when we have no hope, no future, and no vitality for life. From this state of being, Jesus calls us: "come out!" In the first reading, God already declared "I will raise you from our graves... I will put my spirit within you, and you shall live." That same hope of a new life continued in the second reading from Rom. 8:8-26, where St Paul explains the reality of spiritual death and being alive in the spirit, "...But if Christ is in you, although your bodies are dead because of sin, your spirits are alive because of righteousness. If the spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through His spirit who dwells in you."

There is physical death that occurs when our vital internal organs fail to function, and our breath ceases. There is spiritual death too, which occurs when the life of faith is no longer active in us, and we chase after an illusory sinful life. St Paul in Eph. 2:1-6 says: "As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient... But because of His great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved. And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with Him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus."

Lazarus is a symbol for us all. We often feel that we are in a tomb due to the challenges and struggles of life and our wrestling against the flesh and powers that are antithetical to the life of faith. Hence, we feel cut off from life and buried in darkness of sin, hopeless despair and desolation; a state which Fr Michael Fallon describes as a situation where one feels "hopeless, dead; disappointed in a relationship that has lost its spark; sucked into the quicksand of sin and unable to find any solid ground or to struggle free; entombed in a cold dark place with a huge boulder blocking out the light – a boulder too heavy for us to move aside by our own power."

Today's Gospel is a powerful reminder that God does not want us to be either in a state of hopelessness or to be a walking dead, wallowing in darkness and sin. That is why the climax of the gospel comes when the voice of Jesus penetrates through the darkness of death as he calls: "Lazarus, here! Come forth!" Followed closely by the divine authoritative command: "Unbind him! Let him go free!" Jesus most importantly wants to rescue us from spiritual death. He calls us by name to "come out" from any form of entombment we are in. Jesus weeps when he finds us bound by a habit of sin, by addictions or by past hurts. Jesus wants us to be free. I wish to end with these words of Bishop Barron, "each of us to a degree, is spiritually dead. Maybe you're like Lazarus - four days in your tomb. Maybe you feel there is just no hope for the likes of you." He continues: "I don't care how far you've fallen. I don't care how dead you are. The voice of Jesus can pull you out of the tomb." Being more unambiguous, Bishop Barron said "Maybe you're sunk in an addiction. Maybe you've done things that you are so ashamed of that you can't even bring yourself to speak of them. Maybe you've fallen out of a relationship with the people you love the most. Maybe you've been a first-class jerk. Maybe you just feel you're a failure. Maybe you're terrified of dying. I don't care. Listen for the voice! 'Untie him and let him go.' '

My dear friends in Christ, the same Jesus who cured people who suffered grievous illness-blindness as we read last Sunday, is the same Jesus that today brought Lazarus back to life. He did it as a sign of greater things to come. He did it for us to place our hope in Him knowing that there is nothing that He cannot do for us. Let us listen to the voice of the one who loves us that calls us to "come out" from darkness into light and live.
