Palm Sunday Reflection

Palm Sunday, also called Passion Sunday of the Lord, marks the beginning of Holy Week — the holiest week in the Christian calendar. It begins with Jesus' "triumphal" entrance into Jerusalem on a donkey (or an ass). Jesus mounted the donkey as a humble way of fulfilling the words of the prophet Zechariah about the Messiah —

"Tell ye the daughter of Zion, Behold, thy King cometh unto thee, meek, and sitting upon an ass, a colt, the foal of an ass" (Zech. 9:9).

Holy week finishes with the Paschal Triduum. These are the three days that highlight the most important points of our faith - the final moments of Christ's life as He applied Himself to the fulfilment of the will of the Father, namely the institution of the Eucharist, the suffering, the death on the cross, and the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Triduum is one celebration spread across three days. We are meant to be part of these three celebrations that start on Thursday.

Today the Church therefore commemorates Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem to fulfil his Paschal mystery and to save humanity. Certainly, many things come to mind each time we celebrate Palm Sunday. Just looking around the Church we see the decorations, with palm fronds which are to be blessed and preserved for use on Ash Wednesday, and the Red vestments. In the story we hear of the disciples who did the preparations for Jesus to eat the Passover. On the other hand were the Jewish leaders who made themselves barefaced enemies of Jesus. They watched as the crowd was animated in their admiration of Jesus the Messiah, laying their cloths and palm fronds on the road, an equivalent of a "red carpet reception" today. They understood what was happening as the crowds proclaimed: "Hosanna to the Son of David." They were fearful of their positions of power and influence and saw Jesus as a threat that must be eliminated.

As the story progresses, we see the likes of Peter who denied Jesus and the other disciples who were nowhere to be found after Jesus was arrested. Finally, we see Judas Iscariot who betrayed Jesus, and Pilate the representative of Caesar.

In the Passover and passion events, we see truly the spousal Love of Christ that triumphs on this day of joy! It is the Love of God that calls us to follow Christ in love, to share in His glory and His triumph.

As we celebrate the holy week, let us ask ourselves: Am I a fickle disciple of Christ like Peter and the other disciples who denied and abandoned Jesus? How many times have I betrayed Jesus like Judas with my many sinful acts and omissions? How many times have I failed to love Jesus in the needy, by failing to clothe the naked, to visit the prisoners and the sick or to help the poor? Real life situations can make us do what we are not proud of, but with deep faith and love in our hearts, we will still make a difference in the world.

From 18-20 May we will convene an Archdiocesan Summit which will consider seven priorities and give momentum to the implementation phase of the Plenary Council. The Summit will be a threeday gathering of all the faithful in the Archdiocese of Brisbane in order to empower, inspire and equip them to engage more energetically in the mission of the Church. It will look to the global Synod on synodality late this year and prepare for the Archdiocesan Synod in 2024.

We will meet in the city's inner-west for keynote presentations, workshops and panel discussions with a focus on prayer, mission and the shape of faith communities. There will also be moments of personal encounter with Christ through prayer, praise and the Eucharist.

NEW COVID GUIDELINES FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE

Recently, in reviewing our current protocols, we consulted with a infectious diseases expert. He has encouraged us to resume normal practices as much as possible as in his words, "Covid will remain part of the human viral ecology for the foreseeable future".

We will reintroduce the reception of communion from the chalice from Holy Thursday, 6 April.

- Sign of Peace: People may choose to shake hands or embrace if they wish to do so.
- Veneration of the Cross: It is recommended that parishioners be encouraged not to kiss the cross during this time (alternatively, wipes could be provided to be used if necessary).

In our Churches we will start implementation of these from 6th April 2023. Those who are unwell should refrain from the chalice or receiving communion on the tongue. We understand that some members of our community might not be comfortable with these changes, we encourage you take your time and take personal responsibility to the level upon which you want to embrace these new guidelines.
