4th June 2023 — Feast of the Most Holy Trinity — Year A

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Today the Church celebrates the greatest mystery of our faith -TRINITY. The doctrine of the Most Holy Trinity teaches that God is ONE in three persons: FATHER, SON, AND HOLY SPIRIT. This is a mystery that on the surface seems contradictory, but it is a divine truth to be believed. Other Abrahamic religions believe in God as Christians do, but Christian belief in God is distinctive and profound, because we believe that God is One in three persons. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are three divine persons and each one is distinct from the other, each has a perfect will and intellect, and each is capable of loving and knowing to a perfect degree, each person is really and truly God, but still, there is only one God. It is the perfection of their ability to know, to love and to act as ONE that makes them UNDIVIDED IN UNITY.

According to Fr S. Joseph Krempa, a spiritual writer, scripture provides the link between the inner life of God and us. "God the Father created all His children in His image and likeness and breathed into them the breath of life (Gen. 1 & 2). When human beings rebelled against God and wandered off, God disregarded human rebelliousness and infidelities and never abandoned us." We see this in the first reading, God descended in the form of a cloud and revealed himself as "God of tenderness and compassion, slow to anger, rich in kindness and faithfulness." Through many prophets God tried to call humanity back to Himself, but we didn't heed His call. He sent Jesus, His begotten son, out of love to redeem us and give us eternal life. In Jn 10.30-38 the people wanted to stone Jesus because He revealed that He is one with the Father. In Jn 1:1-3 we read that in the beginning was the word and that the word was God, then in verse 14 the word became flesh and dwelt amongst us. Jesus, God the Son, became flesh to save us. Last week we celebrated Pentecost, a day that the promised Holy Spirit came upon the apostles and Mary in their midst and the Church was born. We read too that the Holy Spirit indwelling in us aminates and builds us into a spiritual abode for the Trinity, and the Holy Spirit comes from the Father and the Son to help us on our journey, to sanctify us and make us holy. In the second reading we see Paul blessing the people with the trinitarian blessing: "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all." All said, the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity calls us personally to reflect on the glimpse of the inner life and communion found in the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This inner life of the Trinity is love and unity.

Celebrating this great mystery of our faith, we are called to a life of a mutual self-giving relationship built on unity and love, for God is love (1 Jn 4:16), and unity binds the Trinity. We are called to treat other people with tenderness and compassion and to be obedient to God.

As the last groups of children receive their confirmation this weekend, we pray that the Holy Spirit (the third person of the Trinity) who is the ultimate teacher, will inspire and teach them to be the best members of the body of Christ. May she help and lead them on the right way to go, to become true observers of all that Jesus has commanded us. We congratulate the confirmation candidates and thank their family members, the sacramental team, volunteers and all parishioners who have helped and prayed for them throughout the preparation period.
