9th April 2023 — Easter Sunday

The Tomb is Empty - Christ Our Hope is Risen. Alleluia!

Christians, to the Paschal Victim. Offer your thankful praises! A Lamb the sheep redeems: Christ, who only is sinless, Reconciles sinners to the Father. Death and life have contended in that combat stupendous: The Prince of life, who died, reigns immortal. "... Yes, Christ my hope is arisen: To Galilee he goes before you." Christ indeed from death is risen, our new life obtaining. Have mercy victor king, ever reigning! Amen. Alleluia.

This beautiful poem is the Sequence of Easter. It articulates profoundly the message and meaning of Easter. Christ who was crucified, the prince of life conquered death by rising from the dead on the third day. In the gospel of the Easter vigil mass, we read that "The tomb is empty and the burial cloths neatly folded." Mary Magdelene and the other Mary went to the tomb early morning of the first day of the week to anoint His body. Instead of seeing the lifeless body of Jesus, they saw Him who defeated death, rose and restored life. He came to them and said, "go and tell my brethren, go to Galilee, there they will see me" (Mt 28:7). These were signs that He is risen.

Since the fall of our first parents - Adam and Eve - and indeed humanity through disobedience and rejection of God, darkness enveloped the whole world and from it came death and sin and all kinds of wickedness. The world immediately divided into the world of "light and righteousness" and that of "darkness and sin". Mirroring these two invisible worlds, St Augustine in his book *"The City of God"* stated that those who follow the light, and through their lives promote justice, are sharing those things necessary for life, are citizens of the City of Heaven, and are those predestined for salvation. While those who follow the delusory life of sin and darkness, perpetuate injustice and oppress the poor are citizens of the City of the World, predestined to share eternal damnation. He concluded that being in the City of Heaven leads to true peace of the soul and the world.

Prior to Jesus' sacrifice and death on the cross, a huge stone formed a wall between us and God, and humanity had lost the capacity to have a spiritual life. This was done by human disobedience and decision to push God, the author of life, out of the human life. It was a choice of death, which effectively destroyed our own spiritual life and limited our view of reality and existence to the here-and-now without any hope of eternity with God. This is what Jesus' death and resurrection restored. The huge stone has finally been rolled away. Alleluia!

Today the words of the Psalmist in Ps. 118, 24 - "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice in it and be glad" fill our hearts. Today Christians all over the world rejoice for "The Prince of Life, Who Died, Christ our Hope is Risen. Alleluia!"

Dear brothers and sisters, Jesus, the Eternal Word of God, the first born from the dead, came as the new Adam to conquer death. He has defeated sin, sickness, disappointment and sadness. He rose to die no more and has become the source of spiritual life to all who believe in Him. This is why we shout out Alleluia.

Christ was raised so we can share His New Life; to all who believe, love and obey Him have been given the power to be children of God. This is the Gift of Easter Sunday! Jesus is our peace. I wish you all a fruitful, blessed, and happy Easter. May the life of the Risen Lord flow through our veins, so that every thought, word and deed of our lives may shout out: Jesus Lives!

NEW COVID GUIDELINES FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE

Recently, in reviewing our current protocols, we consulted with a infectious diseases expert. He has encouraged us to resume normal practices as much as possible as in his words, "Covid will remain part of the human viral ecology for the foreseeable future".

We will reintroduce the reception of communion from the chalice from Holy Thursday, 6 April.

- Sign of Peace: People may choose to shake hands or embrace if they wish to do so
- Veneration of the Cross: It is recommended that parishioners be encouraged not to kiss the cross during this time (alternatively, wipes could be provided to be used if necessary)
- Holy water fonts may be filled.

In our Churches we will start implementing this from 6th April 2023. Those who are unwell should refrain from the chalice or receiving communion on the tongue. We understand that some members of our community might not be comfortable with these changes, we encourage you take your time and take personal responsibility to the level upon which you want to embrace these new guidelines.
